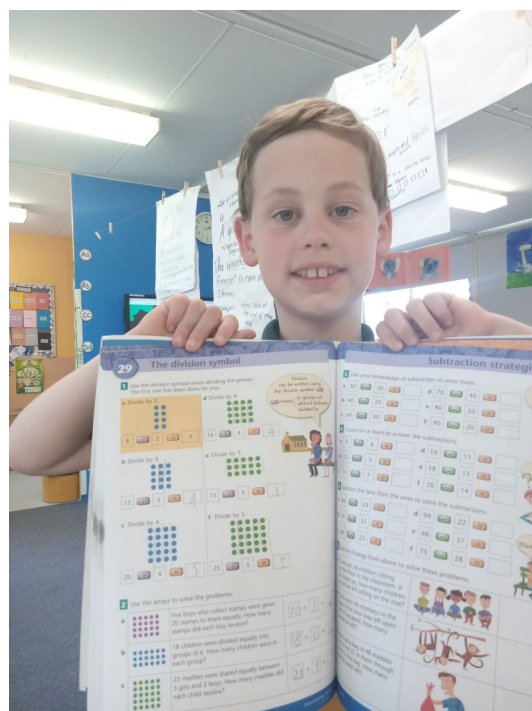

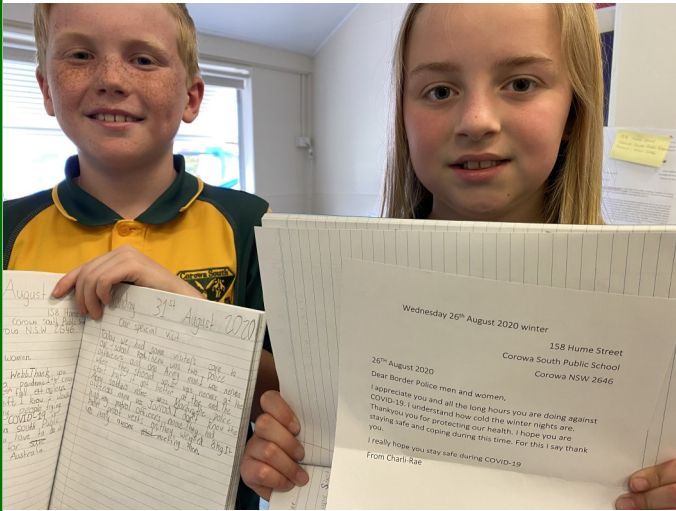

# Wibigang News

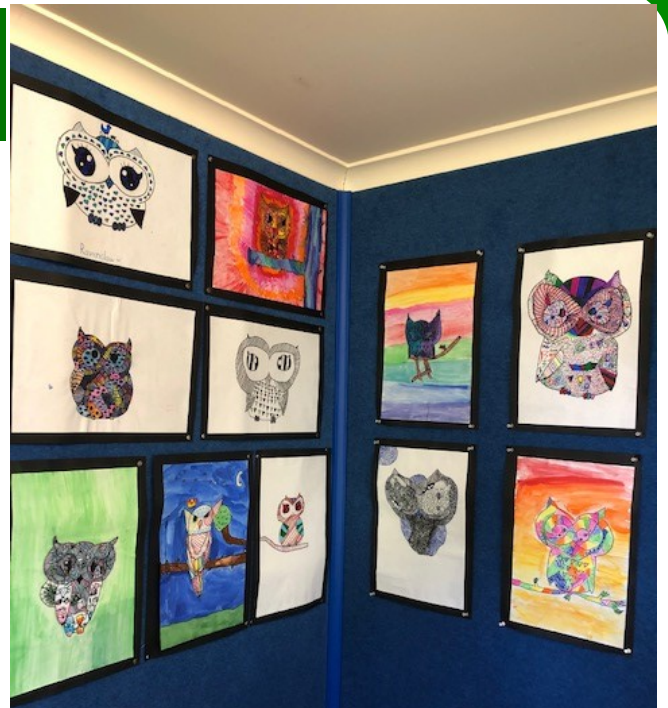
**Wednesday 9th September 2020**

I would like to personally thanks Mrs Hicks and her husband for engraving my Grandfather's name on my ottoman as a gift for him. **Liam**

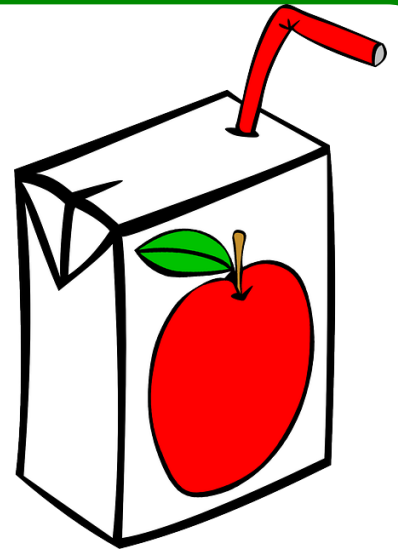
